#### You CAN make a difference!

When faced with big issues like immigration and poverty, we might think there is nothing we can do as individuals. Only those with political power can affect change, we assume. But that is a faulty assumption. We can make a difference in other peoples' lives by the choices we make in our own lives.

Take your morning cup of coffee for example. In August, the Social Justice committee served coffee from Cafe Justo at one of our coffee hours. As the website states, "Cafe Justo is a grower owned coffee cooperative based in southern Chiapas Mexico, formed to address the poverty and migration from Mexico to the U.S.A." By being in control of coffee production from start to finish, they are able to provide a living wage with benefits to their workers, keeping people from leaving their homeland. What began as a ministry with the Presbyterian Church has had a direct and dramatic effect, providing training and resources needed for farmers to create and maintain a sustainable, small-scale, international coffee company, shifting the profits from large, international companies to the members of the cooperative.

Members of our congregation responded positively to the high quality, organic, environmentally conscious and good tasting coffee served on August 18th, several asking how they could purchase the coffee for their own use. It is easy to order directly from the Cafe Justo website: www.justcoffee.org

Regular, decaf, and 1/2 regular 1/2 decaf is available in one pound and five pound bags shipped directly to your home.

Choosing coffee from Cafe Justo is a way we can connect our faith and daily life, loving our neighbors as ourselves and making a real difference in the world!

# **Honoring Indigenous Peoples**

October 14th is Indigenous Peoples' Day, a national holiday since 2021 to celebrate and honor Native American peoples and commemorate their histories and cultures. This month our church denomination, the ELCA, offers two online webinars for us to do this:

Indian 101 will be offered on Thursday October 10th from 1–3pm and Indigenous Thought & Theology will take place on Thursday October 24th from 1–3pm. Both classes are led by Vance Blackfox, Director, Indigenous Ministries & Tribal Relations. No pre–registration is required. Taking the opportunity to better understand our indigenous siblings is a concrete way to honor the committment we make through our weekly land acknowledgment in worship.







# **Truth and Healing Movement**

Introducing our synod to the <u>ELCA's Truth and Healing Movement</u>. I am personally in the very beginning of doing this work and I certainly do not have a perfect roadmap for any individual or ministry site in our synod. However, this movement is significant to me personally, perhaps because I grew up in Custer, SD with Crazy Horse Mountain up the hill (always an unsettling contrast); maybe because trips to Pine Ridge Reservation made it so incredibly obvious that, at least in South Dakota, we gave our Indigenous siblings the worst possible land; maybe because I was a voting member at the 2017 Churchwide Assembly when we voted to repudiate the Doctrine of Discovery, maybe because I look at the map of our synod and I see reservations and Indigenous populations whose stories I believe I should already know.

From the website: "The ELCA's Truth & Healing Movement is an opportunity for this church to increase our understanding of our colonizing impacts on Indigenous people in the past and present. Over the next several months, there will be opportunities to learn, raise awareness and engage in other ways to impact hearts and lives across this church. We believe that the truth, and our knowing and embracing it, is the first step toward healing for all of us. # Things you can do now:

- Watch the one-hour documentary <u>Native Nations: Standing Together for Civil Rights</u>, about the role
  of the Lutheran church in the American Indian civil rights movement of the 1970s and 1980s.
- Read about and begin using Land Acknowledgements as a community.
- Find a book in the bookshop <u>Native Reads</u>. Vine Deloria Jr's classic God is Red would be a great book to read across the synod. Please let me know if you would like to lead a few online discussions of this book.
- Join one of the many one-time <u>online classes</u> being offered this summer and fall.
- Get to know the Indigenous neighbors in your community or region.

In entering into this movement we are "speaking the truth in love" (Ephesians 4:15) and loving God and neighbor (Matthew 22:37–39) in powerful ways. This work will not result in justification before God. It is simply one more way to respond to a God whose love is abundant and ever flowing.


