People: We are to love our neighbors.


Leader: Lent calls us to concentrate upon our baptismal vocation to be a sign of the New Earth.

People: Lent calls us to face the darkness without holding a flashlight. (Flames of the Spirit pg. 29)





"Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."



<u>Isaiah 58:1-12 (CEV)</u>

Shout the message! Don't hold back.

Say to my people Israel: You've sinned! You've turned against Adonai.

Day after day, you worship God and seem eager to learn God's teachings.

You act like a nation that wants to do right by obeying God's laws.

You ask God about justice, and say you enjoy worshiping Adonai.

You wonder why God pays no attention when you go without eating and act humble.

But on those same days that you give up eating, you think only of yourselves and abuse your workers. You even get angry and ready to fight.

No wonder God won't listen to your prayers!

Do you think the Adonai wants you to give up eating and to act as humble as a bent-over bush? Or to dress in sackcloth and sit in ashes?

Is this really what God wants on a day of worship?

I'll tell you what it really means to worship God.

Remove the chains of prisoners who are bound unjustly. Free those who are abused! Share your food with everyone who is hungry; share your home with the poor and homeless.

Give clothes to those in need; don't turn away your relatives.

Then your light will shine like the dawning sun, and you will quickly be healed.

Your honesty will protect you as you advance, and the glory of the Adonai will defend you from behind.

When you beg the Holy One for help, God will answer, "Here I am!"

Don't mistreat others or falsely accuse them or say something cruel.

Give your food to the hungry and care for the homeless.

Then your light will shine in the dark; your darkest hour will be like the noonday sun.

God will always guide you and provide good things to eat when you are in the desert.

God will make you healthy. You will be like a garden that has plenty of water or like a stream that never runs dry.

You will rebuild those houses left in ruins for years;

you will be known as a builder and repairer of city walls and streets.

(*** Adonai is the name of God that comes from "YHWH")

Psalm 51:1-17

L: You are kind, God! Please have pity on me.

C: You are always merciful! Please wipe away my mistakes.

L: Wash me clean from all of my mistakes and guilt.

C: I know about my mistakes, and I cannot forget the burden of my guilt.

L: You are really the one who knows all that I have done;

C: I have disobeyed you and have done wrong.

L: So it is right and fair for you to correct and punish me.

C: I have sinned and done wrong since the day I was born.

L: But you want complete honesty, so teach me true wisdom.

C: Wash me with hyssop until I am clean and whiter than snow.

L: Let me be happy and joyful! You crushed my bones, now let them celebrate.

C: Turn your eyes from my mistakes and cover my guilt.

L: Create pure thoughts in me and make me faithful again.

C: Don't chase me away from you or take your Holy Spirit away from me.

L: Make me as happy as you did when you saved me; make me want to obey!

C: I will teach sinners your Law, and they will return to you.

L: Keep me from any deadly sin. Only you can save me!

Then I will shout and sing about your power to save.

C: Help me to speak, and I will praise you, Lord.

L: Offerings and sacrifices are not what you want.

C: The way to please you is to be truly sorry deep in our hearts.

This is the kind of sacrifice you won't refuse.

2 Cor 5:20b-6:10 (CEV)

We were sent to speak for Christ, and God is begging you to listen to our message. We speak for Christ and sincerely ask you to make peace with God. Christ never sinned! But God treated him as a sinner, so Christ could make us acceptable to God.

We work together with God, and we beg you to make good use of God's gift of undeserved grace. In the Scriptures God says,

"When the time came,

I listened to you, and when you needed help,

I came to save you."

That time has come. This is the day for you to be saved.

We don't want anyone to find fault with our work, and so we try hard not to cause problems. But in everything and in every way we show we truly are God's servants. We have always been patient, though we have had a lot of trouble, suffering, and hard times. We have been beaten, put in jail, and hurt in riots. We have worked hard and have gone without sleep or food. But we have kept ourselves pure and have been understanding, patient, and kind. The Holy Spirit has been with us, and our love has been real. We have spoken the truth, and God's power has worked in us. In all our struggles we have said and done only what is right.

Whether we were honored or dishonored or praised or cursed, we always told the truth about ourselves. But some people said we did not. We are unknown to others, but well known to you. We seem to be dying, and yet we are still alive. We have been punished, but never killed, and we are always happy, even in times of suffering. Although we are poor, we have made many people rich. And though we own nothing, everything is ours.

Matthew 6:1-6, 12-21 (CEV)

When you do good deeds, don't try to show off. If you do, you won't get a reward from your Creator in heaven. When you give to the poor, don't blow a loud horn. That's what show-offs do in the synagogues and on the street corners, because they are always looking for praise. I can assure you that they already have their reward.

When you give to the poor, don't let anyone know about it. Then your gift will be given in secret. God knows what is done in secret and will reward you.

When you pray, don't be like those show-offs who love to stand up and pray in the synagogues and on the street corners. They do this just to look good. I can assure you that they already have their reward.

When you pray, go into a room alone and close the door. Pray to God in private. God knows what is done in private and will reward you.

Forgive us for doing wrong, as we forgive others.

Keep us from being tempted and protect us from evil.

If you forgive others for the wrongs they do to you, God in heaven will forgive you. But if you don't forgive others, God will not forgive your mistakes.

When you go without eating, don't try to look gloomy as those show-offs do when they go without eating. I can assure you that they already have their reward. Instead, comb your hair and wash your face. Then others won't know you are going without eating. But God sees what is done in private, and God will reward you. Don't store up treasures on earth! Moths and rust can destroy them, and thieves can break in and steal them. Instead, store up your treasures in heaven, where moths and rust cannot destroy them, and thieves cannot break in and steal them. Your heart will always be where your treasure is.




